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#### The Future of Motorcycling?

On Saturday, June 5, on one of this spring's all too rare sunny days, I had the opportunity to experience a first in all my years of riding; a ride on an electric motorcycle.

It was Demo Day at Greater Vancouver Powersports in Surrey and the demo crew from the Zero Motorcycles factory in Santa Cruz,

California were stopping here as part of their northwestern U.S., BC & Alberta swing. After chatting with the factory reps, checking out the different models, (4), and filling out the waiver form, it was time to hit the road. So far everything had been pretty much the same as the various Harley, Triumph and Victory demo rides I've had over the years but that was about to change.

The first thing I noticed was that the seat height was a lot more like the Metric and British bikes I rode in the 60's and 70's than the cruisers of my last 20 years or so of riding. I figured I could still deal with a bit of tippy toeing so I flipped the power switch on and twisted the throttle. BIG surprise! Twisting the throttle brings an response and this little bike can scat! I'm up to 50 - 60 K in no time and it's all happening with just a faint whisper of sound.

I resisted the urge to see how far I could go before the battery died and actually took a short ride of only 4 or 5 K but I was able to put it through it's paces pretty good. Loafing along at about 20 K, a twist of the throttle got me over 90 K in less than a

block. The advertised top speed for the Model S that I was riding is I 105 K but I didn't try to verify that. I do have some respect for City speed limits you know! By the way, the range for this bike between charges is up to 80 km depending on speed and driving conditions and to fully charge a low battery takes approximately 4 hours.

Brakes are especially important on an electric bike since you have no engine compression to help slow you down and it just freewheels when you release the throttle so I was happy to discover that the 2 piston front and 1 piston rear disk brakes hauled you down in a hurry when applied. The ground clearance made cornering a breeze and I'm sure the sport bikers out there could take much better advantage of it than I did.

All in all it was a very enjoyable experience and I wouldn't have minded spending more time with this bike. At a price ranging from \$9,500 to \$11,500 CAD, not many of us are likely to rush out and buy one right away but with the factory already working on a backlog of orders, prices are bound to come down and the bikes will get even better than they are. 





#### **Ignored Again!!**

. Once again motorized cycles have been ignored by Translink. May as Motorcycle awareness month has passed with little or no input or notice from the


regional transportation administration. Some buses have posters urging drivers to be aware of Motorcycles, but the web site fails to mention us and insured cycles cannot participate in the Commuter challenge comparing difference modes of transportation.

Millions are being spend on uninsured cycles by both Translink and the city of Vancouver, but virtually no funds being dedicated to promote or recognized the powered two wheeler. BCCOM and individual riders have been asking to be recognized and promoted for over a decade, with little success. It seems transportation engineers are obsessed with electric and pedal cycles and public transit.

They consider motorized cycles to be cars operating on two wheels - single occupant vehicles. It seems few engineers or politicians ride an insured cycle so they have not had the opportunity to enjoy the feeling of riding a motorcycle and reap the benefits they can offer. In good weather it is a lot more enjoyable to ride a motorcycle or scooter than

to squeeze in on public transportation and our share of total emissions is so small it is almost immeasurable. It is only when the motorcycle community can act together and prove to Translink and other agencies how valuable insured cycles can be. Check out Translink.ca and register to talk to the board or at least send an email or two. We have to keep trying as Translink can help with motorcycle safety along with general promotion.

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

Regardless of any road safety initiative motorcycling can never be made risk-free, no more than walking can be made risk-free. Most riders are fully aware of the fact that they are vulnerable road users.

It cannot be denied that a minority of motorcyclists are "high-risk takers" with an extreme behavior, but this is also true for 4-wheeled vehicle drivers, and even, cyclists. This minority often gives motorcyclists a bad public repu- Smokey tation, but should not be considered as representative of the motorcycling population. Absolute figures do not show the true picture of motorcycling casualty trends. Not taking the parc increase/decrease into account distorts the exposure risk and may lead to inappropriate answers. There is a need to monitor the effects of various road initiatives more effectively. safety

The extraction of data from police reports on accidents is of major interest to motorcycle safety but varies significantly between Member States. This is a formidable obsta- July 17 cle to meaningful analysis and comparison. There is a July 18 need to improve and utilize data collected by traffic police August 15 more effectively. Europe should develop and introduce a September 19 uniform Pan-European traffic crash report form.

Better education of traffic police officers is needed to improve their understanding of the likely course of events in motorcycle accidents.

Devising effective countermeasures requires comprehensive research into the current causes of motorcycle crashes and to define the motorcycle population at risk.

Statistical information, both in qualitative and quantitative terms, is a general problem when talking about motorcycle safety.

Europe should encourage the use of a common methodology for EU and national studies on motorcycle accident causation.

EU Member States should provide reliable and consistent statistics to all EU and international databases of reference such as CARE. It could help motorcycle safety if the industry redesigned some advertising campaigns.

Europe and its Member States should ensure that motorcycle research is carried out by experts who are motorcyclists themselves.

#### **Visitations**

To date this year, we have done 101 Visitations and 16 phone consultations. We have helped family members and made one vocational referral which has been successful. We currently are visiting four downed riders.

One rider (quadriplegic) has been discharged and is now back home in the Kootenays. Another is a young motorcyclist who was injured while riding his ATV and is paraplegic and we have extended our services to help him. Another, from Nanaimo, was hit by a deer and is paraplegic. We have also been visiting and helping another local rider (paraplegic) for over 2-1/2 years now and it looks like he is getting ready to go home.

We have taken the first downed rider out to the Pitt Stop Restaurant twice now, in his own handicapped adapted van. He always wears his Pitt Stop Hoodie that we bought him for his birthday and really enjoys going out there. He also needed to have his van delivered to his home and we arranged to deliver his van to the Kelowna airport where his partner took delivery of it. Yours truly did the delivery and flew back on the plane.

That was a total disaster. I had not flown for over 20 years, preferring the bike and I was not aware of the new security procedures. When I got there they told me to put my bag on the conveyor belt and asked me if I had any gels or explosives. I said no and they let the bag go through the xray machine. Funny thing, they never checked my bag but took my word for it. Funny way to do security. However, my artificial leg set off the alarms as I walked through and they waved a beeping magic wand all over me.

off. So I took it off and hopped through the machine. The leg had to go on the conveyor belt through the xray machine (why I don't know - they could already see it). I now had a problem We currently have two teams of volunteers who do Visitations though, I didn't have a stump sock with me so I couldn't put the every two weeks (alternating), thus providing weekly visits to leg back on. They had no crutches that I could use and I didn't think I could hop all the way to the plane carrying my bag in one arm and my leg in the other (it's heavy, you know). But a pretty young Security Guard came to my rescue and offered her panti-hose to use as a stump sock.

I offered to help her take them off but she said she could handle it. And she did, too, but I suggested she get a pole installed to help her out. She said that wouldn't be allowed on the job. (Hey, I got to keep the panti-hose as a souvenir!) The flight



was uneventful with cloud cover obscuring the ground during most of the flight; riding is much more fun. Many thanks to I explained the leg and showed them but they insisted I take it Tanja who drove me to GF Strong to get the van and picked me up at the airport on my return.
