

Words from our President:

Several years ago, we were visiting a rider from the Kooteney's who ended up in an power wheelchair due to his permanent injuries.

They were releasing him from the rehab after mega months, of which everyone was very excited. In comes a phone call from his wife who was in tears as nothing had been done to his house to accommodate him. No ramp to get into the house, no equipment installed in the bathroom so he could transfer from his wheelchair to use the facilities and nothing in the bedroom to help him get in bed, and his wife definitely could not pick him up even to put him in bed.

So I asked her how much of a grouch she can be, of which she informed me that she was quite good at being one. My reply was good now call his Case Worker and tell her or him that they can do whatever they want but he is not coming in the house. She did.

She was later informed that her husband would stay in the Hospital for 2 more weeks while they make the house wheelchair accessible. She called us back relieved, thanking us for the help and quite amused how fast they changed their plans.

Two weeks later we receive a call from his wife that as he was in no condition to travel in a vehicle for long periods of time, they were flying her husband home but his power chair is too heavy for the Helicopter. Since his Wheelchair Van was here, our Visitation Director loaded the power wheelchair van and drove to the Interior to deliver it to them; upon arrival he also filled it with gas and grabbed a flight home.

14 Years And Still Going Strong


Once again, our Show n Shine at GF Strong was a success. Lots of bikes registered, some modified to accommodate disabilities:






A Bikers Prayer: The Ride

A Tires Age?

Recently some of us were discussing the age of tires, safety, especially on 2 wheeled vehicles. One must determine the age of a tire is an important factor to consider in maintaining the quality and safety of a vehicle. As tires age, their quality decreases as a result of weather, storage conditions, and usage. In fact, studies have proven that the rubber components in tires have a tendency to dry up after 6 years, even if they have never been used. This deterioration increases the risk of a malfunction such as a flat-tire or blow-out that would decrease the overall operational safety of your vehicle. Although it is impossible to pinpoint an exact expiration date, as a general rule, all tires (even your spare ones) should be replaced, some articles say 6 years others 10 years from the date of manufacture.

If you are unsure of their age, you can always refer to the sidewall of the tire to find the date the tires were manufactured. The Department of Transportation (DOT) requires Tire Identification Numbers (or Tire Serial Numbers) to be included on each tire. These codes consist of the letters DOT, followed by a series of numbers and letters. For tires that were manufactured after the year 2000, the last four numbers of the code will identify the week and year in which the tires were manufactured. For example, the following identification number indicates that the tires were manufactured in the 51st week of the year 2008: DOT CX8J 3C2 5108. For tires that were manufactured before the year 2000, the date will be represented in the last three digits of thfe tire. For example, the following identification number indicates that the tires were manufactured in the 40th week during the 8th year of the decade (1998): DOT U2LL LQLR 4088.



Up until now it has been busy with a lot of riders going down, due to the good weather. Unfortunately, many were single vehicle accidents which can impact negatively unless the rider has full coverage. Lack of full insurance coverage is another problem we see more frequently with the reason given as it is too expensive. A sign of the economic times, I guess.

As noted on our web site Home Page, so far this year we have visited 43 downed riders 105 times and helped 14 family members. Support to them is just as important because often they are left to deal with the morass of regulations and with ICBC and the private insurance carriers. Here's hoping the rate dies down with the coming of winter.
